

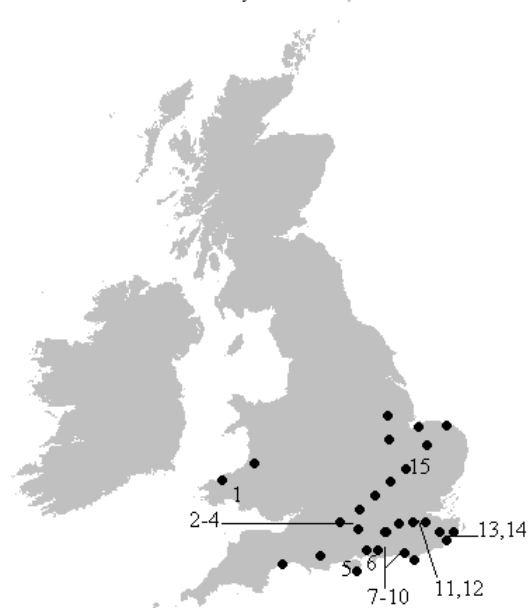

Scrophulariaceae

IUCN category (2001)

Endangered. Endemic.

Habit

Annual herb.

Habitat

Herb-rich downland turf on chalk and soft limestones, recently discovered in calcareous flushes, a lead mine and coastal grassland in Cardiganshire. Lowland.

Reasons for decline

Ploughing up of its habitat and agricultural improvement of downland pastures.
