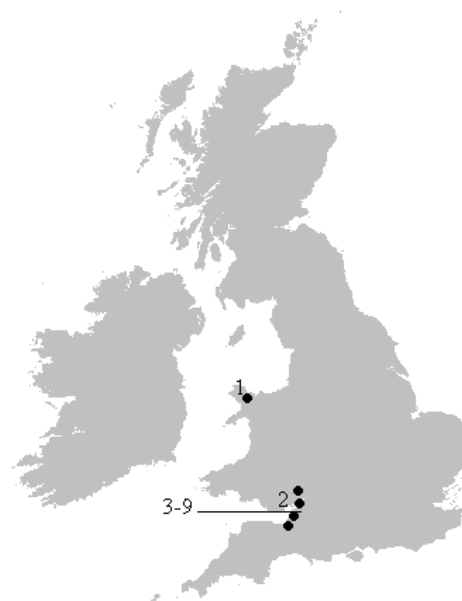


Sorbus eminens E.F. Warburg
