Slender annual herb.

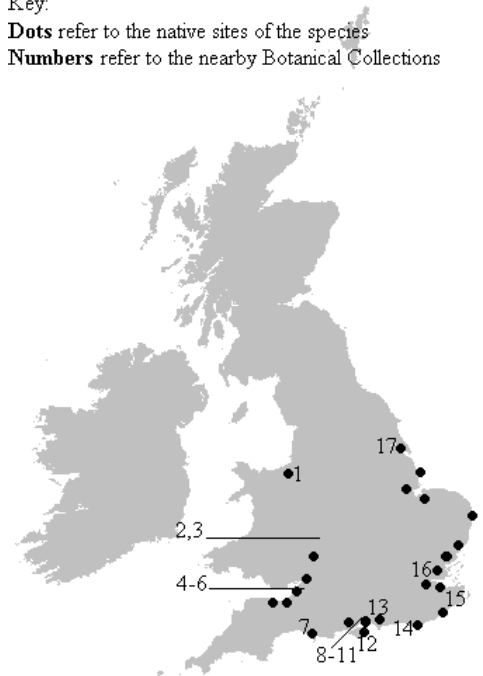
### **Habitat**
