Campanulaceae

IUCN category (2001)

Endangered

Habit

Biennial herb.

Habitat

In open woodland, on banks and rock outcrops.

Substrates: dry, well-drained, sunny sites on fairly infertile sandy or gravelly soils.

Reasons for decline

Cessation of coppicing and other disturbance in woodland, and the increased use of herbicides on roadsides and railway banks.
