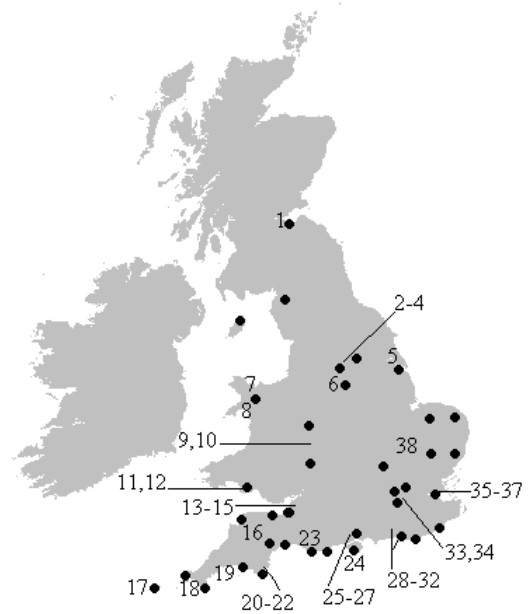
Habitat

- Propagation

Seed - sow spring in situ. Most of the seed usually germinates within a few days of sowing.

- Cultivation

An easily grown plant, succeeding in most soils but disliking shade. It prefers a moderately fertile soil.
