Vulnerable

Habit

Annual herb.

Habitat

Open heathlands habitats, growing on sandy and peaty soils of relatively high base-status which are damp in winter and spring; also in damp pasture, woodland rides, dune-slacks and on cliffs. Lowland.

Reasons for decline

Lack of grazing and the upgrading of heathland tracks with hardcore.
