Life cycle

Flowers from June to August. Seeds are not thought to last for very long in the soil. Germination is mainly in the spring, but some also occurs in the autumn.

Habitat

Open, disturbed habitats on light, often sandy soils, arable fields, sea-shores, roadsides and waste ground.

Associated uncommon species:

Corn Spurrey can often be found with species such as Corn Marigold, Weasel's-snout and the rarer fumitories.

Reasons for decline

The recent decline is due to a combination of the high levels of nitrogen applied to competitive modern crops, use of broadspectrum herbicides and increases in the proportion of the cropped area sown with winter cereals.

Seed - sow spring or autumn in situ. Some seed germinates in the autumn in the wild while some germinates in the spring.

• Cultivation details

Prefers a sandy lime-free soil and a sunny position. A calcifuge plant, requiring a neutral to acid soil. The flowers are only open in the morning.
